Tying the Knot: 150 Years of Wedding Fashions

It is perhaps the most important day in a person's life, the day a happy couple says, "I do." A wedding has many elements and the spectacle of the whole event is best encapsulated in the reveal of the wedding gown. The bride in her grand attire captures not only the attention of the groom, but also the guests. They will say how beautiful the bride looks and some might well remember back to when they "tied the knot." The new exhibit at the Campbell House Museum seeks to capture the remembrance of weddings of a bygone era and how fashions have changed over the years. *Tying the Knot* showcases 150 years of wedding fashions from 1869 (pictured at right) all the way to 2019.

Wedding fashions and traditions as we know them have mostly developed since the mid-19th century. When Virginia Campbell married in February 1841, she did not wear a white gown, but is believed to have worn a green dress. It was Queen Victoria who had first worn a white wedding gown just the year before. Though this new wedding fashion may have taken some time to catch on, it created a bridal tradition that has been handed down to the present day.

Tying the Knot will be on view through March 2024 and aims to impart an appreciation of the beautiful details and handiwork of more than 20 wedding gowns. The designs range from traditional, historic silhouettes to a contemporary dress by fashion icon Bob Mackie.

his year marks the 200th **L** anniversary of Robert Campbell's arrival in St. Louis as a 19-year-old immigrant from Ireland. For generations Robert Campbell's family lived in Ulster (the most northern of Ireland's four provinces). The map at right shows locations in Ireland centered around County Tyrone where the Campbell family resided or visited in the 18th and 19th centuries. The background map was published in 1840 in Gilbert's Modern Atlas of Earth.

- 1 **Dublin**: political and cultural capital of Ireland
- 2 Londonderry (Derry): largest town in northwest Ireland and port of departure for America by both Hugh Campbell (1818) and Robert (1822)
- **3 Bracky**: birthplace of Hazlett Kyle (d. 1833), father of Virginia Kyle Campbell
- 4 Aughalane House: built by the Campbells in 1786 and birthplace of Robert, about 1/2 mile from the village of Plumbridge
- 5 Corrick Abbey: religious site founded in the 6th century by St. Columba and burial place of the Campbell family in Ireland
- 6 Malin Head: northernmost point in Ireland and site along Hugh Campbell's 1818 escapade before emigration
- 7 Enniskillen: birthplace of John Mullanphy (d. 1833), prominent St. Louis merchant
- 8 Ulster-American Folk Park: Aughalane House was moved here in the 1980s

September 11, 2023 - The Journey Begins

At the airport meet Campbell House Executive Director Andy Hahn and your St. Louis-based tour directors Dea Hoover and Declan Rutan of Are We There Yet? We fly on Delta Airlines, connecting through Atlanta before our overnight flight to Dublin.

September 12, 2023 - Welcome to Ireland

Once we arrive in Dublin, sit back, relax, and enjoy the green rolling pastures as you travel westwards through the Irish midlands towards the coastal city of Galway and the region known as Connemara. Our home for the next two nights is in Galway, where we enjoy a welcome dinner in the hotel.

September 13, 2023 - Galway and the Aran Islands

After breakfast this morning we head further west still, escaping from the hustle and bustle of the city and ride the ferry to Inishmore, the largest of the three Aran Islands Tonight is yours to explore Galway and enjoy dinner on your own in one of city's many lively pubs and restaurants.

September 14, 2023 - The Road to Northern Ireland

Enjoy breakfast at the hotel before our journey towards Northern Ireland. Before we cross the border we make a few stops along the way, including Ballymoe and the newly opened Father Flanagan Visitor Centre, the Knock Shrine and Sligo. We end our day in the walled city of Derry, Northern Ireland, also known as Londonderry. We check into The Ebrington Hotel, our home for the next three nights and the location of our included dinner this evening.

September 15, 2023 - Malin Head, Donegal and Derry

Enjoy breakfast at the hotel before our excursion to the Inishowen Peninsula in County Donegal and Malin Head, the most northerly point of Ireland. We return to Derry this afternoon where you will enjoy the award-winning Derry City Walking Tour. This evening is free for you to enjoy on your own.

September 16, 2023 –Ulster American Folk Park and the Campbell House

After breakfast at the hotel, we head towards Omagh and the famous Ulster American Folk Park and Aughalane House, the ancestral home of Robert Campbell. On our return trip to Derry we will visit Plumbridge, the quintessential Irish village where Campbell spent his boyhood.

September 17, 2023 - Giant's Causeway and the Antrim Coast

This morning we bid farewell to Derry and travel to Limavady and Giant's Causeway. Our tour continues along the Antrim Coast Road with spectacular views of the northern coastline and, if the weather is in our favor, you might even see Scotland's Mull of Kintyre across the sea. This afternoon we arrive in Belfast City, at the Grand Central Hotel for our two-night stay. Tonight, enjoy dinner at the hotel.

Sept 18, 2023 - Belfast and the Titanic Museum

This morning you will enjoy a tour of Belfast City and see the City Hall, recognized as one of the finest Classical Renaissance buildings in Europe. We'll also visit the Linen Hall Library and Grand Opera

House. After the tour we visit Titanic Belfast, a state-of-the-art visitor center which tells the story of RMS Titanic, from her conception in Belfast to her famous maiden voyage and tragic end.

September 19, 2023 - St. Patrick Centre to the Center of Dublin

We bid farewell to Belfast this morning and head south to County Down. We stop at the quaint little town of Downpatrick for a visit to The Saint Patrick Centre and St. Patrick's Cathedral to see the reputed burial place of St. Patrick. Then it's back to the Republic of Ireland and its capital city, Dublin. Our hotel for the next two nights is centrally located, and this evening we will travel to the Merry Ploughboy Pub for dinner and enjoy one of Ireland's premier shows of Irish music and dance.

September 20, 2023 - Dublin's Fair City

This morning you embark on a tour of Dublin City, founded as a Viking settlement and home to the Irish Parliament. On your tour you will see the Georgian Squares with their 18th Century houses, Phoenix Park, fashionable Grafton St., Saint Patrick's Cathedral, and the Old Library at Trinity College, home to the famous of Book of Kells. Tonight, you will have a farewell dinner at your hotel.

September 21, 2023 - Returning Home

After breakfast we sadly bid farewell to Ireland, heading to Dublin Airport for your flight home.

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From the Archives

Hazlett Kyle Campbell (middle son of Robert and Virginia Campbell) died in March 1938, setting off a fire storm of activity. He died without a will and within months of his death there were more then 1,000 claims against his estate. To help settle the matter, the St. Louis Circuit Court appointed St. Louisan John J. Nangle as special master charged with determining Hazlett Campbell's legal heirs. As illustrated here, this involved a trip to Ireland and England in 1939 to collect evidence and interview claimants.
